



Commodores Comment

The start of the new sailing season is nearly upon us with the Skene work party on Saturday 3rd followed by the first sailing of the year on Sunday 4th. Only a little time left to do all those boat maintenance jobs before hitting the water. Hopefully the weather will have warmed up by then!

This is my first newsletter as Commodore replacing David Parkin who stood down in November after two years. Your committee has had a bit of a shake up with Niel Ritchie joining as Membership and Publicity, Hamish McLulich taking over as Secretary and Gerry Park as Bosun. Ditta Neumann has added the role of Vice Commodore to her role with Juniors. The committee meets once a month and puts in a lot of hard work to keep the club running smoothly.

Every sailing club in Scotland faces the challenge of being an active, vibrant club with a steady or growing membership. ASYC is no different and we are continually looking as to how we can improve the club and attract new members. The membership survey sent out before the AGM gave us some good feedback which we are trying to implement. The key objective for the committee is ***to make the club more accessible, more social, and more friendly leading to more people sailing and membership increasing, resulting in more competitive racing in 2-3 years time.***

With this objective, we are trying a few different things while still keeping the core of the club the same:

The season kicked off with a very successful pre-season social with over 40 members attending a talk by Colin and Anna Ladd on their 5 year sailing trip round the world. We will try to organise at least two other social events during the season apart from the annual prize giving bash. If you have any suggestions please let a member of the committee know.

A Laser 2000 has been added to the club boat fleet to encourage more double handers on to the water. There is also a club boat booking system now live on the website. On Saturdays in April and May we will be running ***pot-luck double hander races***. Experienced racers will be available to either crew or helm double handers (Laser 2000, Fevas, Wayfarers or Stratos) for anyone who would like to improve their racing skills either as a crew or helm. The races are meant to be fun and it is pot luck who you end up with in the boat but if you are interested in tips on how to improve or just want some confidence building before heading out on your own please come along to one of these Saturdays.

Remember, new members for 2018 have free use of the club boats as do under 18s. The club boats will also have new stickers so they are easy to identify as club boats and if you need help rigging just ask a committee member. We want to see the club boats being used and out on the water.

We are trying to improve communication with more use of Facebook and updating the website. Again two way communication back to the committee is also appreciated so let us know your thoughts and ideas.



We are going to try to provide soup and rolls before races on Sundays at Skene at a cost of £1 to encourage sailors to come along a bit earlier and have your lunch before rigging up. Once the Juniors start on the 21st April this will hopefully encourage interaction between the Juniors and the afternoon racers. Once Wednesday night sailing starts why not come along to the Shepherd's rest for a drink afterwards.

Hopefully 2018 will be a great sailing season and I look forward to seeing you all out on the water

New Online Boat Booking System



A new online booking system has been setup for booking out the club fleet of boats, this can be accessed through the club website at: <https://asyc.org.uk/club-information/>

Boats can be hired by members when safety cover is available and boats are not being used for training session.

The fleet comprises

- Optimists
- Toppers
- Lasers with both full and radial rigs
- Laser 2000
- RS Feva
- Blaze

There is a charge for using club boats of £5 for a single hander and £10 for a double hander, but new members have no charge in their first year and under 18's are free. Fees should be placed in the BOAT HIRE honesty box located in the kitchen at both Stonehaven and Loch of Skene. All sailors are required to wear a suitable buoyancy aid and be competent to handle the boat in the prevailing weather conditions. Boats are to be returned to their place of storage in the condition that the hirer would have liked to have found it in. Any breakage / loss of equipment should be notified to a committee member.

AST lessons and Novice racing



Continuing on from a successful season in 2017, Aberdeenshire Sailing Trust is back to offer more sessions.

Sailing teaching is from beginner to race, optimist to Wayfarer/Laser 2000, a range of boats to fit all sizes of sailors.

Launching Lassies is daytime sailing, there are also lessons on offer after work. The trust also offer after school clubs for both primary and secondary pupils and advanced boat handling and racing.

During the Easter holidays a De-rust stage 2+ is on offer.

For powerboats RYA PB2 and Safety boat courses are on offer and land based courses range from boat maintenance to First Aid and VHF.

These courses are very popular. The current plan is to offer more lessons in July/August when the club returns to its Stonehaven base, but no date has been set so far. These sessions are open to club members only and we ask each participant to volunteer 3 rescue boat duties in return.

RYA First Aid Training

Ann from Ocean Youth Trust Scotland is offering this superb RYA First Aid course in our Stonehaven Club house on Saturday 24th March 2018 fromt 9:30 to 16:30

This course gives a great insight and training in how to deal with a casualty on board a bigger boat, as well as deal with injuries away from home and how to recognize and treat common life threatening ailments are also covered.

This course is run to raise funds for OYTS, so costs are £35 for the course (£17.50 concession) plus £35 OYTS membership - £70 per participant.
